What Is Title I?

This federally funded program allows schools to provide services who may need extra help reading grade level academic expectations. The services may be offered by certified teachers, instructional facilitators, and or through supplemental services.

How Are Students Placed in the Title I Program?

All K-8 students are now Title I School wide, which will allow any student to receive supplemental services who exhibits academic needs based on results from the criterion and norm reference testing, classroom assessments, and other instruments used throughout the school year.

How Are Parents Involved?

No Child Left Behind Act...now Elementary and Secondary Education Act provides opportunities for parents to connect with the school. Volunteer shifts, class activities, or parent-teacher committees are all great engagement opportunities that we provide. The building as a whole shares classroom goals or expectations openly with parents, and ask them to do the same. Harrisburg Elementary School connects with parents in-person as much as possible and values all the participation that can be provided. The building also puts together a compact that parents, students, and staff sign at the beginning of the year to show unity in student academic success.
